## Important Information

- All right hand pages must have targets on them at the top of the page in red pen
- If you are absent for a day of notes you must make them up using the class website. You get one day for every day you were gone.
- All notes must be legible or they cannot be scored
- All notes are required they are not optional!
- Notes are typically scored on a 0-3 or 0-5 scale
- Notes may be graded in class immediately following the note taking session, the next day, a few days later, or during a notebook check
- Notes may be graded for a completion credit and then graded later for quality. Typically they are graded the next day in class for completion, and then are graded again for quality during a notebook check
- If you do not finish your notes and therefore get a low score when they are graded, please go home and finish them! They may be graded again later down the road and you can earn full credit for that grade even if you earned a zero or low score for an earlier grade.
